JUNGIAN ODYSSEY

The Jungian Odyssey is now approaching its 3rd year of success as an off-campus, English-language event. At this occasion ISAPZURICH opens its post-graduate training program to students and professionals involved in psychology and related fields—and we welcome as well all others with interest in C.G. Jung & Analytical Psychology.

Taking place each year as a retreat in a different region of Switzerland, the Odyssey especially affords intensive study and exchange, with immersion in the landscapes that so influenced Jung's sense of psyche. In this setting we illuminate traditional areas of theory—for instance dream, fairytale, expressive arts, body-mind, individuation and the collective. Moreover, theory is advanced through the presentation of new research—and through hands-on exploration of theory applied, both to personal development and clinical practice.



2008 INTIMACY

The Jungian Odyssey 2008 takes place in Beatenberg, a quiet mountain village situated at 1200m/3937ft, on the Sun Terrace of the Bernese Oberland. From a tranquil evergreen perch, Beatenberg overlooks Lake Thun and directly gazes on the daunting Eiger, Mönch and Jungfrau. This

landscape truly resonates the conjunction of the near and far, the familiar and unknown—the intimate, and the distant other. Historical visitors include the Dutch Queen Wilhelmine, the Swedish Prince Gustav—and the revolutionary Vladimir Lenin. Not to be forgotten is the Swiss artist Paul Klee, who wrote that in this place, he fell in love for the first time.

VENUE, COST & REGISTRATION

The 4-star Dorint Hotel Blüemlisalp, this year's venue, is a modern chalet with a panoramic view. Amenities include private bath, and use of the sauna, steam bath and indoor pool. At extra cost, Internet access is available by wireless LAN, in the public areas & rooms of the main building only.

The comprehensive Odyssey fee covers • bus transport to Beatenberg and back to Zurich • all conference events • full room & board (excluding dinners on 2 excursion dates). Travel to and from Switzerland is not included. With registration no later than 29 February 2008, the fee per person is EUR 1994.00 (single) or EUR 1909.00 (double). EXCURSIONS



St. Beatus Caves

Having long been the home to herders and farmers, by medieval times the Beatenberg area had become a renowned pilgrimage site. This was owing to Beatus, the 6th-century Irish hermit (or disputedly, the son of a Scottish king), who is said to have expelled a mighty dragon from a local cave. In this spirit we invite you for a hike along the renowned Pilgrimage Trail.

On this trip we will enter the caverns of Mt. Beatenberg to see Beatus's secluded cell, then venture into the mountain's intimate depths: Passing through the dragon's den, we will follow a stream that leads us ever deeper into the mystery of a breath-taking, illuminated network of subterranean lakes and dripstone grottos. The day ends with dinner in the charming historic inn that once served as pilgrimage lodging.

Bernese Oberland

On this excursion you may scale the mountain heights to savor Beatenberg's pristine air and awakening spring life. Typically at this time of year, the meadows are awash with wild flowers and vibrant with creaturely activity.



Our journey begins with a cable car ride to the Niederhorn (1950m/6398ft) for a panoramic view of Lake Thun and surrounding peaks. Those wishing to venture beyond may choose from a number of trails that differ in length and difficulty. Hikers who reach the Gemmenalphorn (2062m/6765ft) may well come face-to-face with wild mountain goats and chamois. Dinner may be had at any one of several alpine restaurants along the way.

The International School of Analytical Psychology Zurich, ISAPZURICH, was established in 2004 under the authority of the Association of Graduate Analytical Psychologists (AGAP International), a Swiss-domiciled, professional society founded in 1954. AGAP is a member of the International Association of Analytical Psychology (IAAP) with training privileges. To date AGAP counts over 500 members worldwide. Donations to AGAP for ISAP are exempt from general communal, cantonal and federal tax in Switzerland. ISAP is an extraordinary member of the Swiss Charta for Psychotherapy, and is thereby recognized by the Health Department of Canton Zurich as a psychotherapy training institution.

On the home turf of the renowned psychologist C.G. Jung, ISAPZURICH conducts full-time post-graduate training that leads to a Diploma in Analytical Psychology. True to the Zurich tradition ISAP's faculty members, guest instructors and trainees from around the world enrich the program with a variety of professional and cultural backgrounds. Lectures and seminars are held in German and English, while personal analysis and supervision are conducted in a number of other languages. Graduates of the diploma program qualify to apply for membership in AGAP and the IAAP. As IAAP members ISAP graduates are entitled to professional practice as Jungian analysts and psychotherapists, depending on regional laws.



ISAPZURICH reaches out to a greater community by opening its regular lectures and the Jungian Odyssey to the general public. Continuing education is offered for general interest, as well as for professionals within and outside of the field of psychology. ISAP's Counseling Service holds confidential, cost-free consultations with individuals seeking analysis or psychotherapy, and refers them to ISAP analysts or diploma candidates of the training program. Therapy and analysis are offered in a number of languages.
